COLOMBIA A retreat in colonial Cartagena is a first for Colombia's favourite designer

ong the weekend playground of wealthy Bogotánians, Cartagena has recently caught the imagination of the \_\_\_\_ outside world to become one of the hottest cities in South America. The new Tcherassi Hotel & Spa will only enhance that image, with its captivating mix of period romance, contemporary style and modern technology. Housed in a beautifully restored 18th-century colonial mansion in the old town, the hotel was designed by Colombia's most successful fashion designer, Silvia Tcherassi, who was born just outside Cartagena and has always felt an affinity with the city. 'It's so vibrant and colourful, you can almost smell the emotion and happiness,' she says. Reinforcing this sense of place was vital to the designer, who oversaw every aspect of the hotel, from the in-room scent to the staff uniforms (inspired by the traditional Colombian folk dance 'Cumbia'), and the vertical internal garden sprouting with thousands of native plants: 'I love the exuberance of nature,' says Tcherassi. The hotel also has a spa featuring indigenous treatments and products by Spain's Germaine de Capuccini, a chic Italian restaurant, Castaño, and four swimming pools (one on the roof terrace for guests only). Check it out during the fifth annual literary Hay Festival Cartagena de Indias (28-31 January), and keep an eye out for future Tcherassi openings.
