The creative design will have you at hello, but the spoils continue throughout your stay. The linens: absurdly soft. The beds: better than your own. The bathrooms: Prepare to be spoiled. The hotel's personal driver and ski concierce are atyour disposal to tool you around town or usher you to the slopes (hauling your gear straight to the lift). But if you'd prefer to stay in, put in some laps at the heated pool or snuggle up with a book (and a plate of cookies) in the downstairs library. It's OK to ask for seconds. And should you later consume a few too many at the ski-in High West Distillery and Saloon, located just down the block, feel free to sleep in and rehabilitate yourself with one of the chef's breakfast specials, which change daily and complement a full menu of both indulgent and virtuous

mendoza, argentina The scene opens with a sweeping view of the Andes, bathed in luminous, pre-dusk light. Long shadows stretch across the Uco Valley and creep up onto the vast fields of perfectly aligned grapevines that stretch well into the horizon. Tucked behind a traditional Argentinian farmhouse is your very own private villa, complete with yoga lessons, a polo field (horses included), sheep (and the dogs that herd them), a swimming pool, and a friendly maid who insists on feeding guests delicious slabs of charred beef cooked on the patio's oversized asado. Located in the heart of one of the most exceptional wine regions in the world, one might assume that this place is for Brangelina-types only, but, incredibly, this destination is a coachclass traveler's dream come true. Welcome to La Tapera, a family-built villa just outside the tourist-infested city of Mendoza. It accommodates only eight guests at a time, but then again-would you really want to share it?
